Quick Key: 14 Ways to Show Medical Necessity for Blepharoplasty

Diagnosis of a medical problem helps prove that eyelid procedure wasn't cosmetic

Each carrier may have its own LCD outlining which diagnoses support medical necessity for blepharoplasty procedures 15822 (Blepharoplasty, upper eyelid) or 15823 (... with excessive skin weighting down lid). But if one of these 14 ICD-9 codes that carriers often consider medically necessary legitimately describes your patient's condition, you're a long way toward demonstrating the eyelid surgery wasn't just for looks.

- 373.4 -- Infective dermatitis of eyelid of types resulting in deformity
- 373.5 -- Other infective dermatitis of eyelid
- 373.6 -- Parasitic infestation of eyelid
- 374.30 -- Ptosis of eyelid, unspecified
- 374.31 -- Paralytic ptosis
- 374.32 -- Myogenic ptosis
- 374.33 -- Mechanical ptosis
- 374.34 -- Blepharochalasis
- 374.87 -- Dermatochalasis
- 374.89 -- Other disorders of eyelid
- 743.61 -- Congenital ptosis of eyelid
- 743.62 -- Congenital deformities of eyelid
- 743.63 -- Other specified congenital deformities of eyelid
- V52.2 -- Fitting and adjustment of artificial eye.
