You Be the Coder: Cherry Angioma

Question: What would the correct ICD-10 code be for a diagnosis of cherry angioma?

Answer: In ICD-10, the hemangioma diagnosis codes are distinct by anatomical site:

- D18.00 [] Hemangioma of unspecified site
- D18.01 □ ... of skin and subcutaneous tissue
- D18.02 ☐ ... of intracranial structures
- D18.03 [] ... of intra-abdominal structures
- D18.04 \square ... of other sites.

In a dermatology setting, you'd be most likely to encounter D18.01.

What is it? A cherry hemangioma is made up of clusters of capillaries at the surface of the skin, forming a small round dome-like shape. They can range in color from bright red to purple.
