Quick Quiz: Pick the Right Modifier to Report Post-Op Cataract Care

Test your after-surgery smarts and make sure you get every cent you deserve

If you're like the majority of optometry practices, much of your work is postoperative care for patients who recently underwent cataract surgery. Are you sure you're getting the reimbursement you deserve? Take this quiz and avoid the many pitfalls of postoperative care coding and billing.
