• Is HIPAA 5010 a thorn in your side? You might benefit from an upcoming CMS seminar. CMS knows that confusion abounds regarding its HIPAA 5010 form, which takes effect on Jan. 1, 2012, and the agency aims to quell those issues with a series of educational events.

On Feb. 11, CMS will sponsor its fourth national conference call on the 5010 form, "CMS's Approach for New Error Handling Transactions: 999 and 277 CA." The call will consist of an educational session, followed by a Q&A.
