READER QUESTIONS: Look to 438.x Codes For CVA Late Effects

<u>Question:</u> We are providing physical, occupational, and speech therapies to a patient who has hemiplegia affecting her dominant side, apraxia, and aphasia due to a stroke. How should we code?

<u>Answer:</u> Nursing is not involved, so you should list the appropriate therapy V code as primary.Remember, the V57.x (Care involving the use of rehabilitation procedures) codes can only be listed as primary, and should be used in therapyonly situations.

You'll use 438.x (Late effects of cerebrovascular disease) codes to indicate the late effects of cerebrovascular disease.

For this patient, list:

M0230a: V57.89 (Multiple training or therapy);

M0240b: 438.21 (Late effects of cerebrovascular disease; hemiplegia affecting dominant side);

M0240c: 438.84 (Other late effects of cerebrovascular disease; ataxia); and

M0240d: 438.11 (Late effects of cerebrovascular disease; speech and language deficits; aphasia).
