## Survey Management JCAHO PAIN STANDARDS PROVIDE FRAMEWORK FOR ALL FACILITIES

Even nonaccredited nursing facilities can benefit from the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations' pain standards, which serve as a blueprint for a pain management program. JCAHO requires facilities to not only evaluate the effectiveness of individual interventions in relieving a resident's pain, but also the overall program. The standards call on long-term care facilities to use the following strategies.

- Recognize the right of residents to appropriate assessment and management of pain.
- Assess the existence and, if so, the nature and intensity of pain in all residents.
- Record the assessment's results in a way that facilitates regular reassessment and follow-up.
- Determine and assure staff competency in pain assessment and management and address these topics during staff orientation.
- Establish policies and procedures that support the appropriate prescription or ordering of effective pain medications.
- Educate residents and their families about effective pain management.
- Assess resident needs for pain symptom management as part of the discharge planning process.
