Test Yourself (Answer): What Does the Revised F325 Surveyor Guidance Say About Swallowing Disorders?

The answer to last month's question should be item 1 below:

- 1. Various direct and indirect causes can affect the resident's ability to swallow, including stroke, pain, lethargy, confusion, dry mouth, and diseases of the oropharynx and esophagus.
- 2. More advanced swallowing studies are almost always required to assess for dysphagia in people who have suffered a serious CVA.
- 3. A clinical evaluation of swallowing may be used to evaluate whether a person is aspirating fluids.
- 4. Aspiration pneumonia is a common consequence of untreated swallowing disorders.
