### Coding Quizzer: Take A Shot At Coding Flu And Flu Immunization

'Tis the season when residents get the flu or receive flu immunizations, so test your MDS coding prowess on these three scenarios.

**Scenario 1.** Mrs. F had been doing well and was ready for discharge to the apartment in elderly housing until she came down with the flu. Currently she has a low-grade fever, general aches and pains, and respiratory symptoms of productive cough and nasal congestion. Although she has taken to bed for a few days, she has had no change in ADL function, mood, etc., and is looking forward to discharge in a few days.

How would you code Section J5 (stability of conditions) for this resident, according to the RAI manual?

**Scenario 2.** The resident receives a flu shot and a vitamin B12 injection on Thursday during the assessment reference period window for O3 (the number of days of injections in the last seven days).

**Scenario 3.** You administer a flu shot to Ms. Jones within the seven-day lookback for Section O1. But would you count the immunization in O1 (number of medications) or just in O3?

#### Answers:

**Scenario 1.** Check 'b' for an acute condition.

**Scenario 2.** Code "1" because the resident received two injections in the same day within the seven-day period.

**Scenario 3.** Yes, says **Rena Shephard, RN, MHA**, president of **RRS Healthcare Consulting Services** in San Diego. Count the flu shot in O1 and also in coding O3 (injections).
