Medicare Compliance: Get The Dates And Signatures Straight

Follow these 3 tips.

When obtaining physician certs/recerts, make sure:

- 1. The physician dates the forms or notation in the chart certifying/recertifying care. "The physician should date the certs/recerts based on the date he/she signs it," advises **Lee Heinbaugh**, comptroller for **PMGO Inc.** in Cleveland, OH. If the certs/recerts are not dated, many FIs will not consider them to be valid, cautions **Jan Zacny**, **RN**, a consultant with **BKD Inc.** in Springfield, MO.
- 2. Don't sign the physician cert form for the physician, instructs **Betsy Anderson**, a consultant with **FR&R Healthcare Consulting** in Deerfield, IL.
- 3. Never backdate the form. "That would be considered fraudulent," cautions **Cindy MacQuarrie, MN, RN**, also with BKD Inc.
