## Reader Questions: Don't Count Closing the Door for Car Transfer

**Question:** I am trying to decide how to code Section GG for a resident who needs help shutting the door once they're in the car. Does shutting the door for them count as dependent, since the assistant provides all of the effort?

Answer: No, says the Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI) Manual, on page GG-51.



"The Car transfer item does not include transfers into the driver's seat, opening/closing the car door, fastening/unfastening the seat belt. The Car transfer item includes the resident's ability to transfer in and out of the passenger seat of a car or car simulator," the RAI Manual says.

Note that if you don't have a car in which you can evaluate a resident's status, especially because of inclement weather, you should code 10 Not attempted due to environmental limitations.
