## **Reader Questions: CUT OUT SKIN ULCER IDENTIFICATION PROBLEMS**

**Question:** In my agency, I find that nurses have a very difficult time differentiating skin ulcers. When I review their assessments, I see a lot of discrepancies. The clinicians don't seem to agree on what type of ulcer the patient has. When the referring physician doesn't specify the type of wound in the referral, I call to clarify the type of wounds, but I often don't get an answer or even the requested clinical notes. What should we do to help the nurses answer the OASIS wound questions accurately?

**Answer:** It sounds like staff education is the first step, says **Cheryl Pacella** with the **Visiting Nurse Association of Boston.** Here are some possible approaches:

• Consult with a Certified Wound Care Nurse, Pacella recommends. To locate someone near you, go to <u>www.wocn.org</u> and click on "WOC Nurse Referral."

• Consider asking your supply vendor or someone from a nearby wound care supply company to give a presentation on this topic, Pacella suggests.
